Universal Free School Meals

- From September 2014, all schools have offered all EYFS, Year 1 and Year 2 pupils a free school meal. This is in addition to the free school meals service previously offered to pupils whose parents were in receipt of qualifying benefits.
- Even if you don't want your child to receive a meal, you should still register, this way the school receives as much funding as possible from the Government. By registering you could raise an extra £1300 to help fund valuable support like extra tuition, teaching assistants, after school clubs, music lessons and sports activities.
